Introduction

Title III of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act requires that states report annually on the **performance** of students who are reported as limited English proficient (LEP) and their **progress** toward achieving English proficiency. In addition, Chapter 386 of the Massachusetts Acts of 2002 (known as *Question 2*) requires English language learner (ELL) students in Massachusetts to participate in assessments of English language proficiency. The Massachusetts English Proficiency Assessment (MEPA) program is administered in order to comply with these state and federal assessment requirements, and to

- measure the progress ELL students are making toward English proficiency;
- identify whether each ELL student has achieved proficiency in English; and
 provide data and resources to strengthen curriculum, instruction, and

Massachusetts also uses MEPA results from the fall and spring to establish whether school districts are making progress in teaching English language learners. This information is required in reports to the federal government.

The MEPA tests are based on *English Language Proficiency Benchmarks and Outcomes for English Language Learners*, which is available at www.doe.mass.edu/ell/benchmark.pdf.

What Assessments Make Up MEPA?

classroom assessment for ELL students.

MEPA is a combination of two different assessments:

- 1. The Massachusetts English Proficiency Assessment-Reading and Writing (MEPA-R/W) measures proficiency in reading and writing for students in grades K–12. The MEPA-R/W is a written test that consists of two reading sessions and two writing sessions.
- 2. The Massachusetts English Language Assessment-Oral (MELA-O) measures proficiency in both listening (comprehension) and speaking (production) for students in grades K–12. The MELA-O is an observational assessment in which each ELL student is observed in his/her classroom while participating in everyday classroom activities. Using a scoring rubric, a qualified MELA-O administrator assesses each ELL student's listening and speaking skills.

The overall scaled score range for MEPA is 400–550. An overall scaled score is available only for students who have scores in each of the tested areas of reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Students who do not have scores in each of the four tested areas are reported as absent. Scaled score ranges for each performance level vary by grade span.

What is "Making Progress"?

ELL students who took the spring 2012 MEPA test (including reading, writing, listening, and speaking) and who also took the MEPA test in spring or fall 2011 are rated on the progress they made this year in learning English. The purpose of this rating is to see whether a student starting at Level 1 is improving his or her English skills enough to no longer need ELL services within five to six years of going to school in the U.S.

The table below shows what is needed to "make progress" in learning English. Each of the lowest four performance levels (*Levels 1–4*) is divided into two steps, Low and High. The top level (*Level 5*) is divided into five 10-point steps.

For students who took the *same* grade-span test in spring 2012 and in 2011 (e.g., grade span 5–6 in both years)

Introduction

Title III of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act requires that states report annually on the **performance** of students who are reported as limited English proficient (LEP) and their **progress** toward achieving English proficiency. In addition, Chapter 386 of the Massachusetts Acts of 2002 (known as *Question 2*) requires English language learner (ELL) students in Massachusetts to participate in assessments of English language proficiency. The MEPA program is administered in order to comply with these state and federal assessment requirements, and to

- measure the progress ELL students are making toward English proficiency;
- identify whether each ELL student has achieved proficiency in English; and
- provide data and resources to strengthen curriculum, instruction, and classroom assessment for ELL students.

Massachusetts also uses MEPA results from the fall and spring to establish whether school districts are making progress in teaching English language learners. This information is required in reports to the federal government.

The MEPA tests are based on *English Language Proficiency Benchmarks and Outcomes for English Language Learners*, which is available at www.doe.mass.edu/ ell/benchmark.pdf.

What Assessments Make Up MEPA?

MEPA is a combination of two different assessments:

- 1. The Massachusetts English Proficiency Assessment-Reading and Writing (MEPA-R/W) measures proficiency in reading and writing for students in grades K–12. The MEPA-R/W is a written test that consists of two reading sessions and two writing sessions.
- 2. The Massachusetts English Language Assessment-Oral (MELA-O) measures proficiency in both listening (comprehension) and speaking (production) for students in grades K–12. The MELA-O is an observational assessment in which each ELL student is observed in his/her classroom while participating in everyday classroom activities. Using a scoring rubric, a qualified MELA-O administrator assesses each ELL student's listening and speaking skills.

The overall scaled score range for MEPA is 400–550. An overall scaled score is available only for students who have scores in each of the tested areas of reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Students who do not have scores in each of the four tested areas are reported as absent. Scaled score ranges for each performance level vary by grade span.

What is "Making Progress"?

ELL students who took the spring 2011 MEPA test (including reading, writing, listening, and speaking) and who also took the MEPA test in spring or fall 2010 are rated on the progress they made this year in learning English. The purpose of this rating is to see whether a student is improving his or her English skills enough to no longer need ELL services after five to six years of going to school in the U.S.

- that measures students' reading and writing skills.
- administrator using the MELA-O scoring matrix.

Scores on both the MEPA-R/W and MELA-O are combined to determine an overall score for each student. Only those students who have taken both the MEPA-R/W and the MELA-O receive an overall MEPA score.

Who takes the MEPA?

All English language learner students in kindergarten through grade 12 who are reported as limited English proficient are required to take the MEPA tests. The only exceptions are some students who are deaf or hard of hearing, students who require an alternate assessment (for reading and writing tests only), and students who require a test accommodation that is not available. Participation in MEPA is required by state and federal laws.
